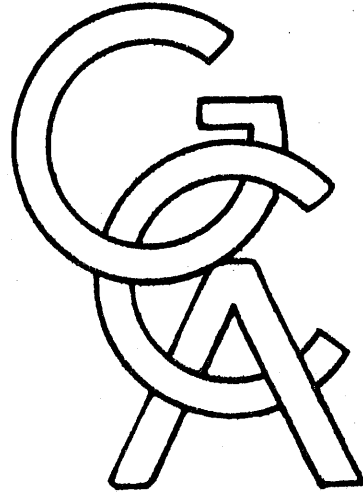

CHATTAHOOCHEE FAMILY FLOAT, NORCROSS TO ROSWELL - Saturday, September 19, 1970

NANTAHALA-LITTLE TENNESSEE - Saturday & Sunday, October 3 & 4

On October 3, we will go once again to the gorgeous Nantahala River for a Saturday trip. We expect that the river will be running on Saturday, since it has been all summer, but it is not possible to be certain until the Friday before. Accordingly, we will meet at Wesser, N.C. (take U.S. 441 to Frankli N.C., then 28 to Junction with U.S. 19, then 19 to Wesser) at 11:00 a.m. If the Nantahala is not running, we will run the Little Tennessee in the same area. Both rivers are Class III-IV. There will also be a run on some river in the vicinity (the Nantahala, Little T, Oconaluftee or Tuskegee) on Sunday if enough people want to stay over. We will camp Saturday night at Lost Min Campground (at Wesser) even though it will be officially closed. All in all, it will be a flexible weekend.
